Prof. Dr. Andreas Schmidt
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Andreas Schmidt started his studies in Civil Engineering at RWTH Aachen and Imperial College London in 1978. In 1986, he graduated from RWTH Aachen and became a Research Engineer at the Institute for Hydraulic Engineering and Water Resources, Technical University Berlin, where he also obtained the PhD in 1993. From 1993 to 1999, Andreas Schmidt was Head of the “River Morphology” section at BfG (Federal Institute of Hydrology, Germany) before becoming Head of the sections “River Systems I and II” at BAW (Federal Waterways Engineering and Research Institute, Germany). Since 2008, he is the Head of the Department of Hydraulic Engineering in Inland Areas at BAW. Andreas Schmidt is also Lecturer for Waterways Engineering at Technical University of Karlsruhe and since 2017 Honorary Professor at the Technical University of Braunschweig. His research interests are mainly related to sediment transport and sediment management, morphodynamic numerical modeling and innovative river engineering measures.
